HUBZone Business

The U.S. federal government limits competition for certain contracts to businesses in historically underutilized business zones (HUBZone). Joining the HUBZone program will make businesses eligible to compete for the program's set-aside contracts. Businesses must be certified by the SBA before applying for the HUBZone program.

To be certified as a DBE, a firm must be a small business owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals.
