Training for Staffing Agencies & Employers That Use Temporary Workers

Of the 5,190 workplace fatalities in 2016, 856 – or 16.5 percent – involved “contracted” employees, according to the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics.

A free half-day training designed for staffing agencies and host employers in Oregon. Learn to develop and implement an effective Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP) as it relates to dual employer situations.

- Why are temporary workers at an increased risk of work related injuries?
- What are your responsibilities under OSHA regulations?
- Does the host company or staffing agency enter the injury on the OSHA 300 log?

A subject matter expert will address these questions and offer strategic solutions to these issues. An OSHA Consultation representative will describe the expectations for staffing agencies and host employers with regard to protecting temporary workers. Examples of best practices for meeting OSHA requirements and preventing injuries and illnesses in dual employer situations will be discussed.

Attendees will learn about:

- Meeting OSHA requirements and expectations for an effective IIPP
- What records you need to keep if an employee is injured and which records the host employer must keep
- Strategies for communicating with host employers about health and safety issues and responsibilities

Representatives of the Oregon Network of the American Staffing Association will also be available to answer questions about resources in Oregon. Attendees will receive factsheets and tools to help implement an IIPP, resources for technical assistance, and a certificate of completion.
