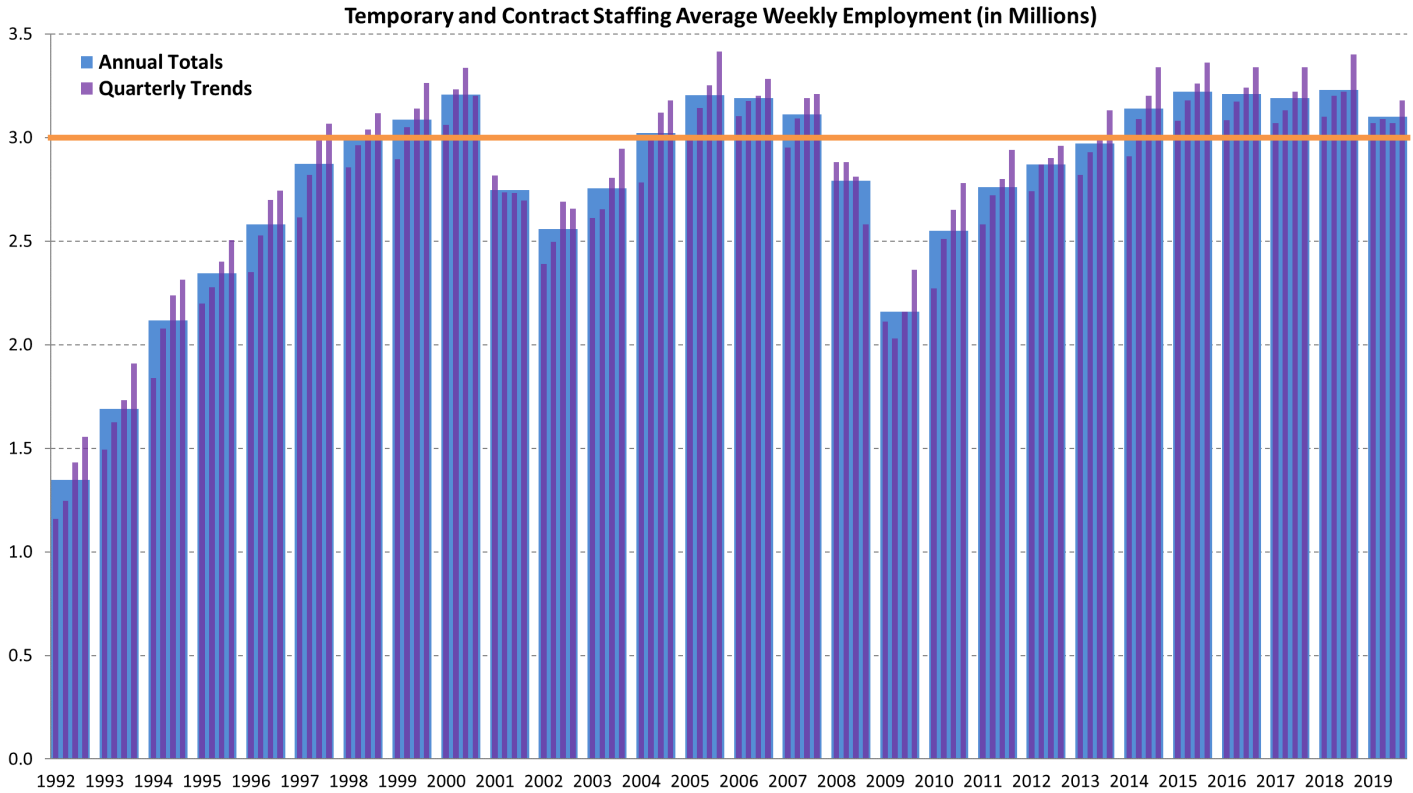


U.S. Staffing Jobs Exceed Three Million for Six Consecutive Years

After the low of 2.16 million temporary and contract employees per week in 2009, it took six years for the staffing industry to fully recover the one million jobs lost during the 18-month 2008–09 Great Recession. In 2019, U.S. staffing companies employed an average of 3.10 million temporary and contract workers per week, according to the quarterly ASA Staffing Employment and Sales Survey, compared with 3.23 million in 2018—which was the highest on record.

The quarterly survey provides staffing data covering approximately 10,000 establishments, including changes in sales, payroll, and employment, broken down by five broad industry sectors and four sales categories, in addition to collecting projections for changes in revenue, gross margin, and net income.
